
ADMINISTRATIVE AND PROFESSIONAL COLLABORATIVE (APC)

Do you think that remote work is a good safety option for employees during a pandemic?



Major Themes

- Initial adjustment/ workspace setup
- Internet service disruptions
- Lack of access to office supplies/printer/scanner
- Technology issues
 - Use of Jabber
 - Computer processing speed
 - IT support for employee onboarding
 - Lack of VPN
- Distraction from people in home
- Lack of boundaries between work and home
- Isolation/ lack of social exchange
- Delayed response time from colleagues


If your position is supervisory, were there any specific challenges that you experienced while supervising staff remotely?

- Tech connectivity issues
- Some resistance to a return to campus
- Training protocols
- Online meeting fatigue/disengagement
- Altered work schedules
- Accountability/productivity issues for some


